

Beryllus, *essedarius*, freedman, fought twenty times; Greek by nationality, lived twenty-five years; Nomas, his wife, made this for her well-deserving husband.

To the spirits of the dead of Marcus Ulpus Felix, veteran *murmillo*, who lived forty-five years, from the nation of the Tungri; Ulpia Syntyche, freedwoman, to her sweetest and well-deserving husband, and Iustus, their son, put this up.

To the spirits of the dead; to Macedon, who, as a new recruit *thrax* from Alexandria, died in his first fight; the whole class of *thracas* from his school put this up for him, well-deserving, having lived twenty years, eight months, twelve days.

To the spirits of the dead of Vitalis, unbeaten *retiarius*, Batavian by nationality; he died here along with his adversary as they fought with equal courage; he was fast and a veteran of three fights. His co-victor put this up to him.
